

AERO CLUB OF WASHINGTON CALL FOR NOMINATIONS: DONALD D. ENGEN AERO CLUB TROPHY FOR AVIATION EXCELLENCE

NOMINATION DUE DATE: March 25, 2025

AWARD DESCRIPTION & CRITERIA:

The Aero Club of Washington was originally founded to promote the Wright Brothers and their efforts. Their initial achievement defined aviation, established excellence as a standard and placed America in a role of global preeminence. The Aero Club seeks to commemorate the Wright Brothers' historic actions by awarding an annual Trophy for Aviation Excellence.

The criteria for the Trophy are as follows:

1. A record of lifetime achievement; or a single event; or a series of acts;

2. By an individual; a team; or by a corporation or organization that reaffirms the Wright Brothers' standard of excellence in aviation.

The following are examples of the types of actions which the Aero Club seeks to reward:

1. Technological advances of national or global significance;

2. Development of aviation policy which significantly enhances the interests of passengers, shippers, employees and industry;

3. An act of extraordinary courage, professionalism, skill and intelligence which advances the science of aeronautics and/or astronautics, or saves the lives of passengers and/or the public at large;

4. A lifetime achievement of enduring value to the nation in any aviation field (academic, airline, manufacturer, media, public service, support services, etc.) which establishes a higher standard of excellence in aviation; or

5. Any other act or series of events by individual(s) which truly embodies the Wright Brothers' excellence in innovation, tenacity, insight, creativity and an essential fascination with flight.

In 1999, after the death of Admiral Don Engen, director of the National Air & Space Museum at the time, the Aero Club Board voted to present the Trophy to Don Engen posthumously. It was accepted in October 1999 by his widow, Mary Engen. The Board also voted to name the Trophy after Don Engen, and at that same luncheon, the Trophy became the "Donald D. Engen Aero Club Trophy for Aviation Excellence." The permanent Trophy resides in the National Air & Space Museum.
